Also, the Secretary informed members that all tournament photographs along with the results have been uploaded to the NPSC website. During the meeting, members also proposed the revival of the UNIC-NPSC Football Tournament.

Overview of the Conference & Vote of Thanks

The members were invited to provide suggestions for potential panelists for the sessions. It was proposed that a Google form would be circulated for members to propose speakers for various sessions.

The Vice Chair, NPSC informed members present about the allocation of conference responsibilities to the Executive Committee Members and requested for wholehearted participation by all.

## Agenda 6: Any other point with the permission of the Chair

The Chairperson informed the members that she had received a document from Mr. S. L. Jain via WhatsApp, endorsed by the former Chairpersons of NPSC, regarding the revitalization of NPSC.

She then provided a point-by-point response to all attending members, addressing various procedural and administrative recommendations during the discussion.

- 1. <u>Induction of New Schools</u>: The suggestion for a screening committee for the induction of new schools was well accepted and has been forwarded to the office of the Secretary, NPSC, for implementation purposes.
- 2. Leadership Transition Protocol: While the current practice of symbolic leadership handover is commendable, she reiterated that we can develop more formal Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) for transitions, covering key positions such as Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, Secretary, Joint Secretary, and Treasurer. Input from members could help refine this SOP, which can then be included as an annexure to NPSC's rules and regulations. She also stated that the current team followed the same protocols for the outgoing Chairperson as those observed in previous years.
- 3. <u>Monthly Meetings and Expenses</u>: It was informed to the members that the regularity of meetings and associated expenses require further deliberation to ensure efficiency and sustainability.
- 4. <u>Efficient and Smaller Administrative Team Structure</u>: The members were informed that the relevant documents confirming the registration of the posts—two Vice Chairs, two Secretaries, and two Joint Secretaries—under the Societies Registration Act could not be located. The Chairperson stated that, since no legal constraints exist, it would be feasible to revert to a smaller and more efficient administrative team.

With no further points to discuss, the Chairperson expressed gratitude to all members for bringing their expertise and experience to the table, engaging in meaningful discussions.

The meeting concluded with a vote of thanks to the Principal, host school, Ms Swarnima Luthra, ASN Senior Secondary School, Mayur Vihar for her warm hospitality and excellent arrangements.

## MINUTES OF MEETING WITH DIRECTOR OF EDUCATION, DELHI GOVERNMENT DATE : TUESDAY, 21 JANUARY, 2025

The National Progressive Schools' Conference (NPSC) held its General Body Meeting on Tuesday, 21 January 2025. The keynote speaker, Ms. Veditha Reddy, Director of Education, Delhi Government, addressed the members and commended NPSC for its commitment to fostering collaboration and excellence in education. She emphasized that NPSC continues to uphold its core values of quality, commitment, and excellence in education.

The discussion focused on key areas concerning education policies, best practices, and inclusivity. The following points were deliberated:

- 1. NPSC has been effectively fostering the exchange of best practices among its member schools.
- 2. A collective effort is needed to build a stronger partnership with government schools to enhance educational opportunities for all students.
- 3. Teachers play a crucial role in the educational ecosystem. There is a need to equip them with the latest developments in education and technology.
- 4. Initiatives should be taken to create structured platforms that facilitate cooperation between private and government schools.
- 5. Given Delhi's influence in shaping national education trends, NPSC must strive to be a role model for the country.
- 6. Members were invited to provide insights on the National Education Policy (NEP) and age criteria for admissions, emphasizing the need for standardized practices across NCR and India.
- 7. Ms. Reddy invited NPSC Principals to establish a cohort to discuss and streamline the implementation of the NEP in Delhi.
- 8. Members suggested that the age criteria for admission under the Economically Weaker Section (EWS) category should be aligned with general admissions.

It was recommended that CWSN students be given an age relaxation of 1–2 years for admissions.

- 9. NPSC members were invited to visit the special needs center established by the Delhi Government and integrate its resources into their schools for CWSN students.
- 10. The Director of Education encouraged NPSC members to collaborate in creating more inclusive schools to support students with special needs.
- 11. A proposal was made to introduce special recognition for schools demonstrating exemplary efforts in the field of inclusive education.
- 12. Members recommended establishing skill-based schools for students with disabilities to enable them to reach their full potential through specialized learning opportunities.

The Director of Education encouraged all members to actively participate in these initiatives to drive meaningful progress in the education sector.

The meeting concluded with a vote of thanks proposed by the Chairperson to the Director Education for sharing her valuable insights.
