The Executive Body Members congratulated the Chairperson, Ms Sudha Acharya for tremendous value addition to the conference. Mr L V Sehgal congratulated the NPSC team for thoughtful themes and sub themes and enthusiastic participation by the delegates. The Ex-Chair, NPSC, Ms Malini Narayanan appreciated the core team for the launch of teasers, videos and banners prior to the conference.

## Agenda -1: Confirmation of Minutes of the Online GBM dated 23 Feb, 2022

The Minutes of the last Online General Body Meeting held on 23 Feb, 2022 were passed unanimously with no observations.

### Agenda – 2: Re-opening of Schools in Delhi / NCR and conduct of CUET-2022

The Chairperson briefed the members that the Schools in NCR re-opened for all classes from April, 2022. She said, NPSC has been voicing concerns and wrote to LG to resume unconditional re-opening of schools.

Members raised their concerns on the sudden announcement of <u>CENTRAL UNIVERSITY ENTRANCE TEST</u> (CUET)-2022 in an All India Level Examination conducted for various Central Universities. The Chairperson briefed the members that the NPSC has written to the HRD Ministry, PMO and UGC expressing apprehension that the introduction of CUET (2022-23) may encourage 'Coaching Culture' among students.

Also, it was briefed to the members that NPSC has written to CBSE on DOE's revised Promotion Policy for Classes IX & XI. NPSC in its communication has written to DOE that the provision for such low target marks for promotion under the revised Promotion Policy will be highly demotivating for teachers and students.

The Executive members raised their concern on the kind of deduction in syllabus by NCERT and requested to the Chairperson, Ms Sudha Acharya to forward and report on behalf of NPSC making suggestions on what all can be excluded from the syllabus.

# <u>Agenda -3: Chalking out the Annual Capacity Building Teacher Training Programme</u> (2022-23) for Teachers and Principals

Members were briefed that NPSC will resume its professional development workshops for teachers and Principals w.e.f. July, 2022. The Chairperson, NPSC informed that a complete listing of online and offline training sessions are being planned in association with CBSE, NCERT and SCERT. It was informed that a few hands on training sessions through interactive activities are in pipeline.

### Agenda - 4: Planning of NPSC Sports Calendar

Secretary, NPSC, Ms Asha Prabhakar proposed to initiate Inter School Tournaments in various Games and Sports w.e.f. 01 July, 2022.

It was proposed to the members to draw out a Calendar for Games and Sports with proposed dates and venues.

It was decided that all rules and regulations along with the eligibility for the event(s) to be hosted will be prepared and circulated by the host school 15 days prior to the tournament.
